A PROFILE OF LIFE MEMBERS

1946 - Mr. W. J. Muir *

Windsor was the foundation secretary of the Association and member of St. John's Footscray. He carried the burden of the Association in the pre-war years. Windsor served as Secretary for 4 years, Assistant Secretary 1 year, Vice President 1 year and President 1 year.

1952 - Mr. W. R. Weisheit *

Ray was the President of the Association from 1942 until 1956 a period of 15 years. He also served as a Vice President in 1940 before assuming the Presidency and was a member of St. John's Footscray. He held the position of Australian President in 1955, Auditor of the Australian Association for 25 years, Vice President of the Victorian Association for 5 years and was made a Life Member of that Association in 1954.

1953 - Mr. W. R. Hindson *

Bob was the Secretary of the Association from 1943 until 1952 (10 years), Vice President from 1953 until 1956 (4 years) and President from 1957 until 1959 (3 years). He held the position of Australian Secretary from 1959 until 1968 a period of 10 years, was a Vice-president of the Victorian Association and was made a Life Member of that Association in 1968. He was also Badminton Referee at the last Commonwealth games, and was a Victorian selector. Bob was made a Life Member of the Australian Badminton Association in 1978.

1957 - Mrs. M. J. Boniface *

Marge served on the committee of the Association from 1948 until 1950 (3 years), Vice President from 1951 until 1958 (8 years) and was Secretary from 1959 until 1979 (21 years). She played badminton with the Association from the early days, was a member of the pennant Team and also served the Victorian Association as a Selector. Marge was made a Life Member of the Victorian Association in 1972.

1958 - Miss. D. Melrose *

Dorrie was the Treasurer of the Association from 1941 until 1957 a period of 17 years. Dorrie was a highly efficient treasurer, unobtrusive by nature and was a member of St. Andrew's Williamstown.

1959 - Mr. A. C. Round *

Allan was the Assistant Secretary of the Association in 1951 and 1952 (2 years) and Secretary from 1953 until 1958 a period of 6 years. He was a first class doubles player credited with many wins and was a member of St. Andrew's Williamstown.

1963 - Mr. R. Mayo *

Russell spent some years on the Committee of the Association before succeeding Dorrie Melrose as Treasurer from 1958 until 1968 a period of 11 years.

1964 - Mr. I. D. Scott

Ian spent some years on the Committee of the Association before becoming Vice President in 1950. He assumed the Presidency in 1960 and served until 1965 a period of 6 years, when he was transferred to Papua New Guinea to establish the Technical College System.

1966 - Mr. A. M. Burnham

Max was Vice President of the Association from 1958 until 1965 and President from 1966 to 1972. He was a Vice President of the Victorian Association and was made a Life Member of that Association in 1973. He represented the Association as a member of the Pennant Team and had a reputation as a doubles player.

1969- Mr. R. Gates *

Bob spent some years on the Committee of the Association from 1951 and was Vice President for four years. He was one of the original playing members of the Association, representing St. John's, Footscray.

1976 - Mr. V. Handley

Vic was Vice President of the Association for eighteen years between 1963 and 1980. He was a Foundation Member of the Umpires Association and served as an umpire for many years.

1979 - Mrs. H. J. Bird *

Heather was Treasurer of the Association from 1971 until her untimely death in 1983, a period if thirteen years. She was a player with North Williamstown Presbyterian, West Newport and St. Andrew's, Williamstown.

1985 - Mr. R. C. Croft

Ray has held many positions of the Committee of the Association. He was Hon. Match Secretary from 1973 to 1977, Vice President in 1978 until 1979 and again from 1983 to 1985, and he was Hon. Secretary in 1980 and 1981. He has represented the Association at the Melbourne Badminton Association, the Victorian Badminton Association and at the Western region Sports Assembly. He has been a member and Treasurer of the now Westgate Badminton Club for many years.

1989 - Mr. A. G. Walsh

Alan became Vice President of the Association in 1982 and was the President from 1983 until 1988, during which time he and his Committee negotiated with the Altona City Council and were successful in obtaining the lease of the Altona Badminton Centre exclusively for Badminton. Alan played with West Newport and Westgate for many years and has now retired to the bowling green.

1996 - Mrs P. Fox

Phyllis became Secretary of the Laverton Club in 1974, when Miss K. Tompkins (a Teacher) left the school after forming the Laverton High School Club, which entered the W.S.B.A. Summer Competition in 1971/72.

Phyllis was also Secretary of the Try Youth Club from 1976-1983. She made the Laverton High School Hall available for tournaments, meetings and finals.

Phyllis helped in the organising and training of Western Suburbs under-age teams from 1974-1985, before the Altona Badminton Centre was built.

Phyllis helped to organise Westchamps in the 1980's and provided refreshments for participants. She is still the Secretary of Laverton Badminton Club.

1998 - Mr R. Gray

Ron joined the Committee of W.S.B.A.Inc. in 1983, was Hon.Treasurer from 1985-1989, Vice-President in 1990, Committee Member in 1991 &1992, Hon. Treasurer from 1993-1995 and a Committee Member from 1996-1998.

Ron has played with Keilor East for some years and prior to that with Essendon.

As a Committee Member, Ron continues to oversee the role of Treasurer, which requires dedication and commitment on a weekly basis for the entire year.

Awarding Ron a Life Membership is a small way of thanking him for his dedication to the continued success of W.S.B.A.Inc.

1999 - Mr A. Black

Alan joined the Committee as Vice-President in 1987 and became Senior Vice-President in 1990. Alan took on the role of the Match Secretary during 1990 and is still currently holding this position. During these years, Alan has been one of the Event Directors for the many successful Tournaments run by W.S.B.A.Inc., including the annual Altona Open & Graded Tournament and Under 13/15/17/19 Selection Tournaments.

Alan has also been the Chairman of our Junior Committee, which organises our Friday Night Junior Competition and Coaching, since 1989.

Alan was a member of and a Selector for the Victorian Junior Badminton Association, a sub-committee of Badminton Victoria for many years and the Event Director for many of their tournaments.

2000 - Mrs P.M. Daw

Pat joined the committee, chairing her first meeting as President in 1989 and still holds this position. Pat took over the day to day running of the Altona Badminton Centre and spent many hours organising the staff and overseeing the administration of the Stadium.

Pat has been involved in the organisation of many W.S.B.A.Inc. tournaments at our stadium and has been the Event Director for an Under 19 Australian Carnival and Under 17 Australasian Badminton Carnival hosted by Badminton Victoria.

Pat was a member of Victorian Badminton Association Council in the 1960's, a member of the Badminton Victoria Review Committee in 1999 and has worked, as a volunteer, at Badminton Australia collating tournament results.

Pat became interested in badminton when she went to pennant competition matches at St Johns Footscray with her parents Ray & Mavis Weisheit and played for about forty years. This is the first time a child of one of our Life Members has also become a Life member, Pat's father, Ray, was awarded a Life Membership in 1952.

2001 - Mrs N. J. Cronin

Natalie began playing badminton in about 1934 and continued playing until about 1989. Nat played in Bendigo & Echuca before coming to Williamstown in 1973 where she joined St Andrew's daytime ladies and then the St Stephen's night competition team which she helped to organise.

In 1985, Nat joined the "Committee for Catering at Official Functions", the highlights of which were the Silver Bowl and the Australian Championships. In the Annual Report for that year, Nat was thanked for her "Special Event" catering and her "attention to detail" in the organisation of the hospitality provide for players, sponsors, officials, guests and volunteers. During the early years of the Altona Badminton Centre, Nat and Jerry were involve in the organisation of Friday Night Juniors and worked as volunteers in the Pro Shop, selling in the Kiosk and taking court bookings.

Nat joined the W.S.B.A.Inc. Committee in 1984, prior to the opening of the Stadium and served as a Committee Member until 1988. Nat took on the role of Honorary Secretary in 1989 and 1990, was Vice-President from 1991-1993 and Senior Vice-President to now. Nat is also the Public Officer of the Association.

2002 - **Mrs H. Black**

Hilary began playing badminton at St Luke's, Yarraville in 1958. Hilary played until the end of the Autumn Season 1999. Hilary served on the Keilor East Committee in 1973, 1977 – 81, 1983, 1984 – 1986. In 1987 Hilary became Secretary and Public Officer and is now in her 16^{th} year of holding these offices.

Hilary, along with Alan, became involved with the Juniors when the Altona Badminton Centre opened in 1985. A Junior Sub-Committee was formed in 1986, Alan became Chairman in 1989 and Hilary has been organizing Friday night Juniors since then.

Hilary has been a W.S.B.A.Inc. Delegate to Badminton Victoria for a number of years. Hilary has been the scorer at our Junior & Open Tournaments for many years and also assists with catering for these events.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

2006, another busy and diverse year for WSBA Inc. Thanks again to my hard working Committee for their valued support throughout the year, Natalie as Vice-President, Robert as Secretary, Ron as Treasurer, Alan as Match Secretary, Pauline as a Committee member and Treasurer of the VJB, Jen as a Committee member, Philip as a Committee member and President of the VJB.

Thanks again to our sponsors, Commonwealth Bank, Epsilon, Cadbury-Schweppes and Smorgon Steel for their continued support.

The year began with two of our tournaments being played in February, following a request from the Commonwealth Games Association to run our Altona Open as a "Test Event" for the Commonwealth Games. It was to be a training session for Umpires and Line Judges, after the International Badminton Federation adopted a new scoring system, the Rally Point system. We were please to be able to support this request and were able to provide flip boards for scoring and our Development Squad members, who had already used this new scoring system, were able to show the umpires how the new scoring system operated. In fact it was a very busy weekend with Umpires and Line Judges from all around Australia in attendance. The only people conspicuous by their absence were the National Squad players, who were instructed not to play.

March saw our Stadium used as the Training Venue for the Commonwealth Games. I would like to thank our WSBA volunteers, Joy Walsh, Norma Cloke, Alan Walsh, Ashley Moss, Richard Wong and Stuart Turner as well as the volunteer medical staff and the Security Staff, who all contributed to assisting with the daily needs of elite players from many Commonwealth countries. The Scottish team presented WSBA with a flag signed by all the team, which Joy and Alan had framed.

Sadly, during the year we lost Bob Hindson, a Life Member and Jerry Cronin, our long time supporter and handyman. Our sympathies are extended to Kath and her family and to Natalie, Ruth and Andrew and their families.

Our Pennant Competition continues to provide great competition from Monday through to Thursday nights, thanks to the efforts of Alan and our Club Secretaries.

The search has been on all year for a Manager and the Committee was unanimous at its July meeting in accepting the recommendation of the Interview Panel to appoint Ron Gray to the position. Ron commenced work in his new role in mid August, just in time to co-ordinate the U15 Carnival.

At the end of September we hosted the second year of the Under 15 Australian Badminton Carnival, which incorporates the Val Nesbitt Trophy (the Teams event). Planning for this event had been underway since early in the year and on behalf of the organizing Committee (Ron, Philip and Pat), I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate this committee and the volunteers from WSBA who helped to make this event a memorable one for all who attended and participated. It was a wonderful 5 days, including a trip to the MCG on the

day prior to the Grand Final, with some great badminton and many new friendships made between the children and adults involved with the twelve participating teams.

On behalf of WSBA, I would particularly like to thank Myrna & Fred Stanlake, our Referees, Peter Roberts for being MC at both, the Opening and Closing Ceremonies, and Corinne Barnard, the Junior Development Officer for Badminton Australia for her wonderful help with the new Tournament Software package.

WSBA entered our own team into this Carnival and were proud to have Daniel Trinh selected in the No 2 Victorian Team. Our WSBA team came 10th and we congratulate Daniel Trinh, Jing Wu and Tegan Berry on their wins in the Plate events. The full results can be found via the link on the Carnival page of our website www.wsbaonline.com .

Early in the year we appointed Michelle Rigg as our Junior Development Co-Ordinator. Michelle's role is to be the contact person for our Primary School Participation Program, oversee our coaches and the roles they take on in all schools' programs both at the Altona Badminton Centre and at the schools. Michelle also co-ordinates our Development Squad and all their activities. Some members of our squad are to spend up to 8 weeks training at the KL Racket Club under Head Coach Ong Beng Teong between December 2006 and February 2007. We hope they all make the most of this wonderful opportunity. Ong Beng spent some time in Australia in the 1980s, coaching at Kilsyth, during which time he developed some strong players who were subsequently selected to represent Victoria and Australia.

Our Development Squad continues to grow and in Term 2 was divided into 2 groups, with one group training on a Thursday evening and the other on Fridays. An extra session is held on Sunday mornings. Congratulations to Tara Marney, Brendan Chu, Steven Nguyen & Daniel Trinh, who have been selected in the Victorian Under 17 squad. From this squad, two teams will be selected to represent Victoria at the Under 17 June Bevan Carnival in Christchurch, New Zealand, over Easter 2007.

The feasibility study for the building of eight more courts is nearing completion and we hope it will be presented to the Hobsons Bay Council early in 2007,

The Paisley Park Masterplan Project Consultative Forum has met several times and this plan is also nearing completion.

I would personally like to thank our Staff for their commitment and dedication to WSBA during the time we were searching for a Manager. Thanks, Stuart, Don, Norma, Alexandra, Stephanie and Georgia, I couldn't have managed without your wonderful support.

MANAGER'S REPORT

Commencing in mid August, my initial focus was directed towards the Australian Under 15 Badminton Carnival that WSBA hosted from September 27th to October 1st. The team's event consisted of twelve teams competing for the Val Nesbitt Trophy. The teams that entered were, Singapore, Victoria 1, Victoria 2, New South Wales, New South Wales Dash, Queensland, Southern Sharks (Tas), Bendigo, Ballarat, Mid Gippsland Geelong/SEBA and Western Suburbs. The event this year had the benefit of housing most of the players at the one location, Quest Apartments in North Williamstown. This provided fantastic accommodation close to the Badminton Centre and made it easier for all players to join in the social functions offered by WSBA. The stadium looked brilliant during the Carnival. National and state flags, advertising boards, banners from our supporters, a spotless venue thanks to our cleaning staff (Don and Stuart) and a hall full of kids, parents and officials, all made for a memorable Carnival.

Over the year we have been working with Hobsons Bay City Council on a feasibility study for the extension of the stadium. Draft plans have been on the notice board recently, and are being fine-tuned and costed so that plans and costings for a staged redevelopment can be presented to the Council in the near future.

A review of maintenance has recently been conducted by the council and quotes have been received by council to upgrade the men's showers, repair the water damaged chipboard in the stadium and upgrade the kitchen facilities to comply with council's food safety requirements. Hopefully these can be completed before we commence our pennant competition in 2007.

The centre is lucky to have a reliable and cooperative group of employees making up our staff. Don, who cleans the foyer and wet areas, has been with us since the stadium opened and has not missed one day in that time. Stuart reliably keeps the stadium floor and surrounds looking its best and also works three out of the four pennant nights. Norma, Alexandra and Stef make up the rest of the casual staff and Richard provides the car park security patrol. During the year, all of our control room staff successfully completed a basic level St John Ambulance course.

JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM 2006

The Western Suburbs Badminton Association has for the last 4 years been committed to developing a structured pathway in badminton for children in the Western Suburbs. The program offers school clinics, junior competition, beginner coaching sessions and a Junior Development squad. From the first three areas, children identified as showing talent for the sport are selected and then invited to join the Junior Development Squad. The aim of this squad is to provide developmental opportunity and encouragement for talented young sports persons to assist them in reaching their full potential in badminton.

Primary School Participation Program

This area of the program delivers school clinics and Active After School Care Programs to the schools in the Western Suburbs. Each school term, using a database of 97 schools, that we have built up, program information and clinic request forms are sent to the Sports Coordinator and when schools allow, we advertise in their school newsletters. This year 380 children participated in the program. They were from the following schools:

- Altona Primary School
- Footscray Primary School
- Bellbridge Primary School
- Yarraville West Primary School
- Williamstown North Primary School
- Seaholme Primary School
- St Mary's Primary School Williamstown

Junior Competition

The competition continues to grow in numbers with 120 children registered to play in graded competition. The competition offers 3 grades that adequately provides for the beginners right up to the A grade Junior player. There will be a Presentation for the Premier Teams at the conclusion of the competition in mid December.

Beginner/ Casual Coaching Sessions

These casual sessions conducted on Fridays and Sundays were originally designed for the very young or real beginner. However this year while the Friday session has mainly attracted the very young, the Sunday sessions are now accommodating junior competition players and squad members looking for some extra court time also.

Development Squad

This year has been most successful, with squad numbers increasing to 45 members and more of the players participating in Junior Tournaments. With the increase in squad members we divided the squad in two, one group training on Thursdays and the other on Fridays. Many of the squad players attended junior selection tournaments this year from U/11's to U/19's. We a hired a bus to transport the players to some of these events.

There were some great results from the players throughout the year, earning them selection in Junior State and National Teams. Under 19 player Ann Slee had a great year gaining selection in the Australian Junior Team after winning the U/19 Girls doubles Title at the Junior Nationals in July. Ann traveled to Korea with the team to compete in the World Junior Championships. Squad members selected in 2006 State and National Teams are as follows

W.S.B.A. entered teams in all age groups for both Junior Victorian and Regional Teams Championships played at MSAC mid year. Players from both our Junior Competition and Development Squad made up these teams, having enough available players in the Under 11 & 13 age groups to enter 2 teams in these sections. The children enjoyed these events having some great games and results with the Under 13 team coming home from both events with the silver medal.

The Val Nesbitt Cup and Under 15 Australian Championships was the highlight of the junior calendar for us this year with W.S.B.A. hosting the event in September. It was a great tournament with 12 teams from around the country, including a representative team from Singapore. The teams' event was played on the first two days; a free day followed with a tour for all teams

to the MCG and lunch at Southbank. The W.S.B.A. representative team had some great results finishing 10th in the event. Tegan Berry ran herself into some fine form winning the Girls Singles Consolation event beating Victoria 2's number 1 player in the final. Tegan then partnered Jing Wu to win the Girls Doubles Consolation also. Daniel Trinh who was selected in the Victoria 2 Team had some great results throughout the carnival and was rewarded with a Under 15 National Ranking of No. 9.
